Job Description

The Director of Development will play a pivotal leadership role, managing a small, committed nonprofit team and two county-based Development Task Force Committees. The successful candidate will be responsible for cultivating and securing new support from high net-worth individuals (HNWI), foundations, and corporations, expanding and diversifying our current donor base while helping to drive organizational change and a greater culture of philanthropy throughout the organization. The successful candidate will be comfortable working across different revenue streams, with substantial experience working with major/principal gifts and boards of directors and fundraising councils.

You will serve as a compelling spokesperson for SEEAG creating excitement about our mission, and inspiring others to support our goals. You will also help identify external advocates and champions for SEEAG and build a structured fundraising council. Most critically, you will have prior experience building and growing a fundraising program to achieve significant year-on-year growth. What does success look like? Over the next 3-5 years the successful candidate will at least double our annual private income from Santa Barbara and Ventura Counties.

Reporting to the Founder and CEO, you will work closely with SEEAG's two Development Task Force Committees and other relevant advisory bodies.

Primary Responsibilities

- Lead, design and execute a development strategy for SEEAG including annual and long-term plans
- Establish and manage meaningful relationships with HNWIs, foundations, and corporations, leading to transformative gifts to support SEEAG's work
- Inspire, motivate and challenge a small development team through active mentorship, ensuring that appropriate budgets, systems, and procedures are in place, and building a culture conducive to partnership development and relationship management
- Oversee fundraising campaigns, identification and qualification of a robust pipeline of principal individual donors and foundations, cultivation and stewardship efforts, solicitation strategies, and the development and timely submission of grant proposals and reports

- Participate in and manage donor events to expand networking opportunities and enrich the experience of current donors, and play a major thought leadership role, identifying opportunities for SEEAG attendance/representation on panels, at philanthropic conferences, workshops, and networking events, as appropriate
- Co-lead the creation and management of advisory Development Committees who champion SEEAG, open doors and networks, increase visibility, and help secure substantial long-term financial support.
- Oversee donor publications and donor communications for Southern CA audiences, working in partnership with the Communications team to align strategies and craft messaging
- Serve as a key advisor to SEEAG leadership (CEO and Board) regarding strategies for private resource mobilization, working with counterpart(s) in other regions, and helping to create an organization-wide culture of development and philanthropy

<u>Requirements</u>

- Minimum 5 8 years' relevant experience in agricultural industry and or fundraising and philanthropy at a senior level in the United States
- Proven experience delivering substantial and sustainable fundraising growth
- Strong agricultural roots and background, including family business, is preferred
- A strong affinity for the mission, ideally grounded in experience with NGOs, academic or agricultural education institutions and communications, or other organizations with public health and wellness relevance
- Successful track record of cultivating, soliciting, and stewarding donors and securing 6 figure principal gifts
- Knowledge of fundraising campaigns and event production preferred
- Experience managing budgets as well as teams, with a strong ability to recruit, train, mentor, and motivate

- Knowledge of, experience and or contacts in the local agricultural industry.
- Entrepreneurial mindset and creative thinking, coupled with strong decision-making and leadership skills; wisdom and good judgment; keen analytical and problem-solving skills
- History of building effective, collaborative working relationships
- Ability to communicate effectively with a variety of internal and external stakeholders
- Strong commitment to establishing and maintaining a diverse, equitable, inclusive and actively anti-racist work environment

Students for Eco-Education and Agriculture (SEEAG), is a two-county based, not-for-profit agricultural education and wellness organization that educates students and the greater community about the farm origins of their food and agriculture's contribution to our nutritional wellbeing.

SEEAG was launched in 2008. Over the past 13 years we are proud to have delivered six new programs to over 65,000 students and adults on the central coast, including virtual distance learning programs. Headquartered in Santa Paula, CA, SEEAG has built a team of approximately 7 employees working across two counties. SEEAG registered as a 501(c)(3) non-profit in 2013 that works to cultivate agricultural ambassadors. SEEAG aims to educate, inspire and empower students to take charge of their eating habits to be their own healthy hero. The Director or Development will strengthen and expand agricultural and grower networks, policy and advocacy influence, partner development, communications, and in particular, fundraising efforts to enhance SEEAG impact on the Central Coast.

In 2021, SEEAG will release an ambitious new Strategic Plan 2021-2024, which outlined a funding goal of \$1.2 million. Based on history and current performance nearly \$600k is secured, primarily from governments, major philanthropic foundations, and local individuals. As part of this strategy, SEEAG aims to diversify its funding base and is investing in increasing private philanthropic fundraising capabilities with the ambition of raising at least \$600k in new philanthropic funding by 2024. SEEAG's fundraising team is expected to play a key role in this effort.
